

## Chapter 4: List of Locations with a Jewish Population in the 19th Century

Following each location name, information is provided indicating its geographical situation:

- the abbreviation of its district in present day Germany (all capital letters) or - when no longer located in present day Germany – the abbreviation of its district in former Prussia in 1871 (mixed capital and lower case letters)
- the abbreviation of either the German federal state (1996) or the province of Prussia (1871)

For those locations no longer located in Germany of today, the current name is provided in <...> brackets.

Following the above, the number of Jewish inhabitants at the location is noted. Where it appears, the letter “N” signifies that a complete list of all the Jewish inhabitants was compiled for the years specified.

The following two examples illustrate the above:

**Aachen**, AC, NRW. (1806:60; 1849:310; 1895:1,342), N=1808-50

The town of Aachen belongs to the district of Aachen (AC) in the present day German Federal State of North Rhine-Westphalia (NRW). In 1806, 60 Jews lived there; in 1849 there were 310; and in 1895 there were 1,342. Complete name lists of the Jewish population (N) of Aachen were evaluated in the present dictionary for the time period from 1808 to 1850.

**Abellienen** = Ilmenhagen, Ger., EPR. <Belinskoye, Kaliningrad obl., Russia> (1812:0; 1871:10)

Abellienen was also named (=) Ilmenhagen. The second name often is an alternative or older name for the location; in the present case, it resulted from the “Germanization” of Slavic or Lithuanian location-names under the Nazi regime. In 1871, Abellienen belonged to the district of Gerdaunen (Ger.) in the Prussian province of East Prussia (EPR.). Its present day name is Belinskoye in the “oblast” (administrative region) of Kaliningrad in Russia. There were no Jews living there in 1812, but 10 in 1871.
