For example, in Salonika, the family מודיאנו belonged to a local Italian congregation (Emmanuel 1936:16). **Phonetic variants:** Modolan <elision of the final -o in Northern Italian>, Modiano <elision of internal palatalized /l/>. **Non-retained etymology1 for Modiano:** from the city of Modena (compare the corresponding entry) (Alboher 2010:129). There is no phonetic reason for the internal change from /e/ to /ia/. **Non-retained etymology2 for Modiano:** from the town of Modiano (Stow 1995:935). This toponym does not appear in available gazetteers. **Morphological variant:** Modigliani <Italian plural suffix -i>.
